

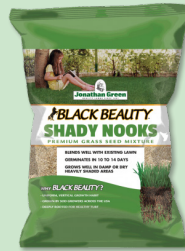

GUIDE TO GRASS TYPES



PERENNIAL RYEGRASS

- Cool-season lawn grass
- Medium to dark green color
- Sharp-pointed tip shape
- Narrow blade width



KENTUCKY BLUEGRASS

- Cool-season lawn grass
- Dark blue-green color
- Boat-shaped tip shape
- Narrow to medium blade width



TALL FESCUE GRASS

- Cool-season lawn grass
- Lighter green color
- Sharp-pointed tip shape
- Medium to broad blade width



CREEPING RED FESCUE GRASS

- Cool-season lawn grass
- Medium to dark green color
- Pointed fine textured tip shape
- Fine blade width
- Spreading growth habit



CHEWINGS FESCUE GRASS

- Cool-season lawn grass
- Medium to dark green color
- Pointed fine textured tip shape
- Fine blade width
- Bunch grass



HARD FESCUE GRASS

- Cool-season lawn grass
- Grayish/dark green color
- Pointed tip shape
- Narrow blade width
- Bunch grass

🚫 WEEDS (NOT GRASSES) 🚫



CRABGRASS

- Light green color
- Coarse leaf blade
- Annual weed
- Reproduces from seed
- Grows in flat, broad clumps that crowd out turfgrasses



QUACKGRASS

- Light green color
- Coarse leaf blade
- Cold-hardy perennial weed
- Reproduces from seed and underground rhizomes
- More difficult to eliminate than crabgrass
