

LIVE INDOOR CHRISTMAS TREE CARE GUIDE



Water the roots and store the tree for several days in a garage (if available) prior to bringing the tree inside your house.




Leave the tree outside for as long as possible before bringing it into your house. Usually, trees will be brought inside a few days before Christmas.



Avoid placing your tree near heat sources that can dry out the needles.



Your tree will likely only need to be watered once or twice during the week it is indoors.



Place your tree on a saucer or other waterproof material to catch any moisture that drains from the roots.



Select a planting location and dig a hole while the ground is soft. If you cannot plant the tree

immediately, you can store it in this hole to prevent the roots from freezing. Cover roots with soil or mulch during storage.



Prepare and plant your tree. Remove plastic pot, gently loosening outside roots. Place in hole 1-2" above soil level, and backfill the hole partway, stopping to lightly compact the soil. Complete filling the rest of the hole with soil mix, lightly tamping again. The soil should be at the level of the top of the root ball.
